Duty of Care

Ribble canoe Club are committed to ensuring that all those taking part in canoeing are able to do so protected and kept safe from harm while they are with coaches, volunteers and /or staff. This is particularly true in respect of children and vulnerable groups.

We all have a duty with respect to Safeguarding and Protecting Children to ensure children can participate and enjoy our sport with the highest possible standards of care. These standards apply also to vulnerable groups. All members should have a clear understanding of operating within an appropriate code of ethics, aware of what their 'duty of care' is and how this relates to their position in providing activities and being responsible for others.
